### The Office of Head Start Announces the Final Rule Supporting the Head Start Workforce

The Office of Head Start (OHS) has <u>updated the Head Start Program Performance Standards</u> (the <u>Performance Standards</u>) to respond to concerns affecting the sustainability of Head Start programs. The changes are designed to stabilize the Head Start workforce and improve the quality of the comprehensive services that Head Start families count on. The final rule regarding the Performance Standards can be viewed in the <u>Federal Register</u> and was published on Wednesday, Aug. 21, 2024.

The final rule contains many aspirational goals that Head Start and Early Head Start support. It intends to allow programs to continue to do what they do best: provide a safe, healthy, and well-rounded classroom experience to young children while offering support and resources to their families.

# 5 ways Head Start programs help families

Provide parenting support and strategies 2

Support parental health and links to community services during pregnancy

Connect families to community and federal assistance

Assist families in identifying and reaching their goals and dreams 5

Provide a career pathway in early care and education



### **Fulfill the Promise of Head Start!**

Urge Congress to support the funding levels for Fiscal Year 2025 (FY25) proposed in the Senate bill, which provides a \$700M increase in Head Start and Early Head Start funding.

Also urge them to prioritize making a \$251 million "down payment" necessary to implement the recent rule, exactly the amount the rule says implementation will cost in FY25.
